



# GRATITUDE BINGO DIRECTIONS

Gratitude Bingo is a fun and engaging way to foster a culture of appreciation among teachers, leaders, and coaches. The idea is simple: a bingo card filled with actions that encourage showing gratitude to others. Participants check off boxes or add stickers or highlight the square as they complete the actions, and when they achieve a bingo (four in a row, four corners, or a blackout), they're entered into a drawing for a prize. It's a great way to build positive relationships and celebrate each other's contributions in the school community.

## **HOW IT WORKS:**

**EACH PARTICIPANT GETS A GRATITUDE BINGO CARD AT THE START OF THE WEEK OR MONTH (GREAT FOR ANYTIME OF THE YEAR!).**

**AS THEY COMPLETE AN ACTION ON THE CARD, THEY MARK THE SQUARE.**

**ONCE THEY ACHIEVE A BINGO (FOUR IN A ROW, CORNERS, OR BLACKOUT), THEY SUBMIT THEIR CARD FOR THE DRAWING.**

**CELEBRATE THE WINNERS DURING A STAFF MEETING OR THROUGH A SCHOOLWIDE ANNOUNCEMENT!**
